## Call of Proposal for Special Sessions at BTAS 2016

- · Recent advances in soft biometrics
- Privacy in biometrics
- Deep learning in biometrics
- Reproducible results in biometrics

## The proposal for a special session should contain:

- 1. Title of the proposed special session;
- 2. Names/affiliation of the organizers;
- 3. A description of the significance of the topic and the rationale for the proposed session; and
- 4. A list of research groups currently active in that area and potential contributors.
